Board of Trustees
Regular Meeting Minutes
November 13, 2018
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The Columbia Township Regular Board meeting was called to order by Trustee David Kubicki at 6:00 p.m.

The Bike Path Extension – we expect prepared bid documents to go out in December upon receiving official approval from Great Parks.

The Little Miami Join Fire District – Our hope is to help effect the sustainability of the district. It is a business and we need to operate with that mind set. We need to understand cost by station and why the cost are what they are.

OPWC SCIP Grants – A decision will likely be made next month with work beginning in July of 2019.

Police Home Base – Sheriff Vehicles temporarily based out of our facility will return to the Silverton base on November 26th.

No Old Business was discussed.

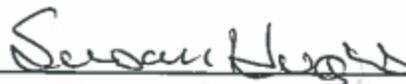
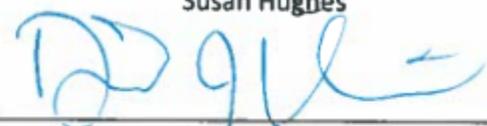
New Business –
