

The Board of Trustees of the Columbia Township, County of Hamilton, Ohio, met in special session at 2:00 PM January 3, 2018 at Columbia Township Administration Building, 5686 Kenwood Road, Cincinnati, Ohio, with the following members present:

Mr. KUBICKI introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 18-01, 2018

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IMPROVEMENTS TO CERTAIN PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY IN COLUMBIA TOWNSHIP TO BE A PUBLIC PURPOSE UNDER SECTION 5709.73(B) OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE, EXEMPTING SUCH IMPROVEMENTS FROM REAL PROPERTY TAXATION, DECLARING CERTAIN PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS TO BE NECESSARY FOR THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THOSE PARCELS, ESTABLISHING A TAX INCREMENT EQUIVALENT FUND, DISPENSING WITH THE SECOND READING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Sections 5709.73 et seq. of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes townships to participate in a financing technique commonly known as tax increment financing; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to use the authority granted pursuant to such Sections in connection with certain improvements in the Township in order to meet the needs of the area, including new development; and

WHEREAS, the Board caused notice to be given to the Mariemont City School District Board of Education (the "School District") and the Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development (the "JVSD"), of its intention to consider this Resolution for adoption as required by Sections 5709.73 and 5709.83 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board to cause an exemption from real property taxes for up to ten (10) years for 75% of the further improvements on the property described in Exhibit A attached hereto subject to any notices required under Sections 5709.73 and 5709.83 of the Ohio Revised Code prior to the adoption of this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Township Trustees of Columbia Township, County of Hamilton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That this Board hereby finds and declares that certain public improvements in the Township, to wit: landscaping of the public right of way; environmental remediation; the acquisition of land in aid of industry, commerce, distribution or research; and the purchase of property rights of way and easements or other rights in property necessary for the completion of the public improvements listed above (collectively, the "Public Improvements"), are necessary as

a result of and for the further development of the parcels of land described in Exhibit A attached to this Resolution (such parcels are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Wooster Development TIF Site"), which parcels are located in an unincorporated area of the Township, and for the creation of jobs, increasing property values and the provision of adequate public services in Columbia Township. The further development of the parcels in the Wooster Development TIF Site will place direct additional demand on the Public Improvements.

SECTION 2. That, pursuant to Section 5709.73 of the Ohio Revised Code, further improvements to the parcels in the Wooster Development TIF Site occurring after the date of this Resolution (the "Improvements") are hereby declared to be a public purpose and are exempt from real property taxation commencing on the first day of the tax year in which an Improvement first appears on the tax duplicate of real and public utility property and ending on the earlier of (1) ten years from the date the exemption commences or (2) the date on which the Public Improvements are paid in full from the Tax Increment Equivalent Fund, as defined in Section 4 hereof. It is hereby determined that (i) a portion of the Improvements shall be exempt from real property taxation, (ii) such portion shall be 75% of the assessed value of the Improvements, and (iii) the Public Improvements directly benefit, or once made will directly benefit, the Wooster Development TIF Site.

SECTION 3. That pursuant to Section 5709.74 of the Ohio Revised Code, the owner or the owners of the Improvements shall be required to make annual service payments in lieu of taxes (the "Service Payments") to the Hamilton County Treasurer on or before the final dates for payment of real property taxes. This Board hereby expresses its intention and authorizes the Township Administrator or the President of the Board of Township Trustees to enter into such agreements as may be necessary and appropriate to assure the payment of such Service Payments.

SECTION 4. That pursuant to Section 5709.75 of the Ohio Revised Code, there is hereby established the Columbia Township Wooster Development Public Improvement Tax Increment Equivalent Fund (the "Tax Increment Equivalent Fund"), into which the Service Payments shall be deposited. Money in the Tax Increment Equivalent Fund shall be used to finance the Public Improvements and to make payments to the School District and JVSD as required.

SECTION 5. That the proper township officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary and proper to carry out Sections 1 through 4 above, including but not limited to filing any required applications for tax exemption with the Hamilton County Auditor and/or State Tax Commissioner.

SECTION 6. Pursuant to Section 5709.73 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Fiscal Officer is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Resolution to the Director of the Department of Development of the State of Ohio within fifteen days after its passage.

On or before March 31 of each year that the exemption set forth in Section 2 hereof remains in effect, the Township Administrator or other authorized officer of this Township shall prepare and submit to the Director of the Department of Development of the State of Ohio the status report required under Section 5709.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 7. That the Fiscal Officer is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor of Hamilton County.

SECTION 8. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code

SECTION 9. The Trustees of Columbia Township upon at least a majority vote do hereby dispense with the requirement that this Resolution be read on two separate days, and hereby authorize the adoption of this resolution upon its first reading.

SECTION 10. By unanimous vote of the Columbia Township Trustees, this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of Columbia Township. The reason for the emergency is to provide for the establishment of the real property tax exemptions referenced above in a timely fashion in order to provide for the efficient development of the Public Improvements and the Wooster Development TIF Site.

SECTION 11. That this Resolution shall be effective at the earliest date allowed by law.

MR. KRITIKOS seconded the Resolution, and the roll being called upon the question of its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:







RESOLUTION NO. 18-07, 2018

**ESTABLISHING JUST AND EQUITABLE SERVICE CHARGES
DURING THE PERIOD FROM OCTOBER 2017 THROUGH APRIL 2018
IN CONNECTION WITH THE REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE FROM

WHEREAS, R.C. 505.82 authorizes a Board of Township Trustees to remove snow and ice from an undedicated road, in the event the owner of the undedicated road fails to provide for the removal of snow and ice, following notice, during the six month period following the adoption of a resolution declaring that an imminent emergency exists which threatens life or property within the township; and

WHEREAS, R.C. 505.82, and limited home-rule powers under R.C. 504.04, authorize a Board of Township Trustees to adopt and enforce within the unincorporated area of the township local police, sanitary, and other similar regulations that are not in conflict with general laws; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with R.C. 505.82 the Board desires to establish just and equitable service charges for the removal of snow and ice from all such undedicated roads and directing notice to the owner and certification of the charges to the County Auditor in accordance with R.C. 505.82.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Trustees of Columbia Township, Hamilton County, Ohio, pursuant to Sections 505.82 and 504.04 of the Revised Code, as follows:

SECTION 1:

The Board hereby establishes just and equitable service charges for the removal of snow and ice from undedicated township roads for the period from October 2017 through April 2018, as determined by the Administrator and Road Superintendent, based on a formula calculating the actual time spent and resources used to remove snow and ice.





Section 2. Pursuant to O.R.C. §505.87, the owners and lien holders of record for the property shall be properly notified of this action and given seven days to abate the nuisance.

Section 3. In the event the nuisance is not abated within the time period allowed, the Maintenance Department of the Township is hereby directed to remove and discard the tall grass, weeds and debris or contract for the removal of the tall grass, weeds and debris from property located 5318 Ellmarie Drive, Columbia Township, Ohio 45227, Auditor's Parcel Number 520-0215-0053-00.



WHEREAS, the Property will not be excluded from Columbia Township under Ohio Revised Code Section 503.07 upon annexation to the City of Cincinnati and shall remain subject to Columbia Township real property taxation; and

WHEREAS, Columbia Township and the City of Cincinnati wish to enter into the proposed annexation agreement (the “Annexation Agreement”) attached hereto as Exhibit 1 to memorialize the terms of the annexation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Columbia Township, Hamilton County, Ohio, for the benefit and welfare of Columbia Township and its citizens, hereby authorizes the Township Administrator to enter into the Annexation Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

AMENDING RESOLUTION 17-36: MEDICAL MARIJUANA

WHEREAS, on June 8, 2016, the Ohio General Assembly adopted Sub. H.B. 523, legalizing the cultivating, processing, and retail dispensing of medical marijuana in the State of Ohio, which became effective September 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of this Resolution, the definitions of "cultivators," "processors," and "retail dispensaries" are set forth in Chapter 3796 of the Ohio Revised Code, effective September 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 3796.29 and Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21 authorize a township to adopt a resolution, prohibiting or limiting the number of, cultivators, processors, or retail dispensaries, licensed under Chapter 3796 within the unincorporated territory of the township, as well as regulating their location; and

WHEREAS, under the Ohio Revised Code, home rule townships, like Columbia Township, may enact resolutions in the interest of the public health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Township; and

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2017, the Columbia Township Board of Trustees passed Resolution 17-36 prohibiting marijuana cultivation and processing in the Township and specifically limiting the number of retail dispensaries to one and its location in the Township to property located in the unincorporated area depicted in the attached Exhibit; and

WHEREAS, the Columbia Township Board of Trustees has negotiated with entities who may be awarded licenses to operate retail dispensaries in the Township at the location in the attached Exhibit that any such entity will pay the Township at least 2.5% of the dispensary's annual gross sales revenue; and

WHEREAS, the Columbia Township Board of Trustees wishes to amend the number of retail dispensaries permitted in the location identified in Resolution 17-36, as depicted in the attached Exhibit to allow up to two such retail dispensaries to operate in the permitted location and to reaffirm that marijuana processing and cultivation are not permitted in the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, COLUMBIA TOWNSHIP:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to its powers under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3796 and Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21, marijuana processing and cultivation are not permitted in the Township.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to its powers under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3796 and Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21, there shall be no more than two marijuana retail dispensaries permitted in the Township. The dispensaries may only be located in the unincorporated area depicted in the attached Exhibit I.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution does not prohibit research related to marijuana conducted at a state university, academic medical center, or private research and development organization as part of a research protocol approved by an institutional review board or equivalent entity.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution is an emergency, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare and shall take effect immediately, the reason for the emergency being the need to amend Resolution 17-36 to allow up to two retail dispensaries to be operated in the area depicted in Exhibit I and to reaffirm that marijuana cultivation and processing are not permitted in the Township as soon as possible.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR AND AUTHORIZING REMOVAL OF TALL GRASS, WEEDS, DEBRIS, AND NON-COMPLIANT VEHICLES, DECLARING A NUISANCE FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6923 BUCKINGHAM PLACE, DISPENSING WITH THE SECOND READING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §505.87 provides that a Board of Township Trustees may provide for the abatement and control over the removal of tall grass, weeds, debris and non-compliant vehicles from land located in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Township Trustees of Columbia Township has determined 6923 Buckingham Place, Columbia Township, Ohio 45227, Auditor's Parcel Number 520-00172-0343-00 and 520-0172-0455-00 are a nuisance;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Township Trustees, Columbia Township, Ohio:

Section 1. That the tall grass, weeds, debris, and non-compliant vehicles located on the property at 6923 Buckingham Place, Columbia Township, Ohio 45227, Auditor's Parcel Number 520-00172-0343-00 and 520-0172-0455-00 are hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section 2. Pursuant to O.R.C. §505.87, the owners and lien holders of record for the property shall be properly notified of this action and given seven days to abate the nuisance.

Section 3. In the event the nuisance is not abated within the time period allowed, the Maintenance Department of the Township is hereby directed to remove and discard the tall grass, weeds, debris, and non-compliant vehicles or contract for the removal of tall grass, weeds, debris, and non-compliant vehicles from property located 6923 Buckingham Place, Columbia Township, Ohio 45227, Auditor's Parcel Number 520-00172-0343-00 and 520-0172-0455-00.

Section 4. The owner of the property at 6923 Buckingham Place, Columbia Township, Ohio 45227, Auditor's Parcel Number 520-00172-0343-00 and 520-0172-0455-00 shall be billed for such services and the Fiscal Officer shall place a special assessment on the real estate tax bill of the property if payment is not made within thirty days.

Section 5. The Trustees of Columbia Township upon majority vote do hereby dispense with the requirement that this resolution be read on two separate days, and hereby authorize the adoption of this resolution upon its first reading.

Section 6. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and welfare of the Township. The reason for the emergency is to provide for safe and habitable properties in the township.



RESOLUTION NO. 18-37, 2018

COLUMBIA TOWNSHIP, HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO

RESOLUTION EXPRESSING CONCERN FOR THE STATE OF OHIO TO
STRENGTHEN REQUIREMENTS FOR SITING NATURAL GAS PIPELINES

WHEREAS, Columbia Township recognizes that the State of Ohio has a growing economic interest in supplying natural gas to businesses and residents throughout the State, and high-pressure natural gas pipelines are being installed throughout Ohio and the region to transmit this gas; and

WHEREAS, high-pressure natural gas pipelines, if ruptured or damaged, can pose significant risk to public safety and the environment due to the high operating pressure and the highly flammable, explosive, and toxic properties of the products being transported within such pipelines; and

WHEREAS, Columbia Township believes that the regulation of the location of high-pressure pipelines carrying potentially flammable, explosive liquids is paramount to preserve public safety and the environment, and the Township wishes to advocate that the State of Ohio pass legislation, consistent with the laws in other states, to more closely regulate and allow for local input concerning the location of such pipelines within Ohio communities; and

WHEREAS, Duke Energy currently has an application pending with the Ohio Power Siting Board to construct a pressurized pipeline throughout Hamilton County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Columbia Township Board of Trustees, Hamilton County, Ohio, for the benefit and welfare of Columbia Township and its citizens that:

SECTION 1. The Board of Trustees of Columbia Township recommend that the State of Ohio enact updated legislation to require appropriate and safe setbacks, allow local input from impacted jurisdictions, and require its agencies to consider public safety in the siting criteria to be considered when weighing a request to construct pressurized pipelines throughout the State of Ohio.

SECTION 2. Until updated regulations can be enacted to add public safety as a specific criteria, the Township asks that the Ohio Power Siting Board weigh public safety and the potential dangers to residents throughout Southwestern Ohio when reviewing the application by Duke Energy for the location of the natural gas pipeline within the Greater Cincinnati community.

SECTION 3. A copy of this Resolution shall be presented by the Fiscal Officer to our local State Representatives and Senators and the appropriate State agencies concerning the siting of the current pipeline throughout Hamilton County, Ohio.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
